

Upcoming Commercial Developments:

- **Wisconsin Battery Company** will break ground on April 23 on a new 100,000 sf research, development and manufacturing facility in the Portage Industrial Park. The facility will include child care, and manufacture hemp-based batteries.

Assessment News

Annual Property Revaluation

Every year properties in the city are re-assessed to market value. An annual revaluation ensures all assessed values reflect current market values.

Assessed values will rise and fall to reflect the previous years market. The Assessor will use comparable sales from last year to best determine your new assessed value.

If there is a change in your property assessment; notice of the new value will be mailed out the middle of March with instructions on how the assessment process works and how to proceed. If you have questions on the value the Assessor placed on your property be sure to contact the Assessor's office to discuss. Once the value is set, it cannot be changed.

Notice to Destroy Weeds

The City requires that all noxious weeds be destroyed prior to the time in which such plants would mature to the bloom or flower state. The growth of noxious weeds in excess of eight inches in height from the ground surface shall be prohibited within the city corporate limits. Noxious weeds shall include any weed, grass or similar plant growth which, if allowed to pollinate, would cause or produce hay fever in human beings or would cause a skin rash through contact with the skin.

DOG & CAT LICENSES

Cat & dog Licenses are due: spayed or neutered pet is \$15.00 per pet, if not spayed or neutered \$25.00 per pet. Licenses issued after March 31st will be a charged a \$5.00 late fee per animal. The 2024 Dog Licenses include access to the dog park. Reminder that all cats and dogs in the city limits MUST be licensed. Each household is allowed up to four cats/dogs total. Pet licenses can be obtained at the Portage Municipal Building, 115 W. Pleasant St.



FIRE DEPARTMENT

As we enter a new year, we also take time to look back on what our Department accomplished. The Department answered 527 emergency calls in 2023 with 23 of those being outside of our jurisdiction to help our neighboring communities. Overall, the Department responded to 40 additional calls or an 8% increase over 2022. In addition, we made operational changes to help improve our response and build relationships with our community partners. The Department also completed our 2023 Annual Report which can be found on our website.



Fire Department Staff

The members of the Department are the backbone of our organization and are what allows us to strive for excellence in everything we do. The Department currently has 30 members, 7 full-time, 22 paid-on-call, and an administrative assistant. We are currently starting a recruitment drive and if you are interested in obtaining an application it is located online at the City's website, www.portagewi.gov/apply-for-a-job/



Fire Safety Reminders

The Department would like to encourage residents to replace the batteries in their **Smoke Alarms** and **Carbon Monoxide Alarms**. We have batteries available at the fire station. If assistance is needed with installing the batteries in your alarms, please contact us at **(608) 742-2172** and we will schedule a time to come and assist you. The batteries we receive are donated each year by Energizer.

What does a Portage Paid-on-Call Firefighter do? Could I do this? Where do I even start?

Portage paid-on-call firefighters go about their everyday lives and when called upon, answer the call during community need. Our team of paid-on-call firefighters come from vastly different backgrounds, professions, interests and we would value YOUR addition to the team. Gaining exposure to matters only the fire service can provide, learning about and engaging in the community, deepening your professional development and making lasting friendships are all part of the everyday life of a Portage paid-on-call firefighter.

Burn Permits

The City of Portage requires a burn permit for all open burning other than outdoor recreational fire pits or fireplaces. The permit can be found on the Portage Fire Department website or you can stop into the Fire Station. For those of you that live outside of the City and wish to burn, you can stop at the fire department or contact the DNR at https://dnr.wi.gov/topic/openburning or 1-888-947-2876.

FIRE DEPARTMENT

The Portage Fire Department wants to thank the citizens of Portage and the surrounding townships for their support in the past election where you chose fire-based EMS over the status quo. We feel blessed that the citizens have placed

their trust in the fire department to provide this life saving care when they need it most.



Now the work starts to build an EMS program that everyone can be proud of. We will be licensed at the Paramedic Level which is highest level of pre-hospital emergency care in the State of Wisconsin. We will be covering the City of Portage and the Townships of Caledonia, Fort Winnebago, Lewiston and Pacific with a projected call volume of 2500 calls. Our busiest time of the day will be between 9am and 9pm with peak call volume being between 3pm and 7pm.

There are many different aspects of starting an EMS Service. We will be working with local, state and national agencies to obtain all necessary documents to be an EMS Service. Over the next several months we will be working diligently to acquire all the necessary equipment to stock our 3 ambulances. We will be working with multiple vendors from across the country to accomplish this. This is no easy feat as there are many different types of equipment that must be obtained from bandages to state-of-the-art cardiac monitors. This will insure that the EMT's and Paramedics will have the equipment they need to be safe, efficient, and be able to provide the best care possible.

Starting in August we will begin the hiring process to look for the best candidates that meet the mission, vision and values of the Portage Fire Department. This will be a multi-facetted process that will involve a written test, skills test and multiple rounds of interviews. This will help provide Portage the best EMT's and Paramedics in the business. Our goal is to start them fulltime in the beginning of November as they will go through an academy process. During this 6 – 8 week process they will learn all aspects of Portage Fire and EMS. Not only will they work with existing staff on the fire suppression, hazmat, confined space and technical rescue, they will be working with our medical director and their team to create a comprehensive pre-hospital emergency program that will advance the medical care provided to our community. Our medical direction will offer innovative and intricate protocols, education and EMS system quality assurance to make sure our community is getting the paramedic care they deserve. FINANCE/TREASURER

Finance/Treasurer's Department

The City of Portage collects taxes for the City, Portage School district, Columbia County and Madison Area Technical College.

How do I get my tax bill?

- 1. Tax Bills are mailed annually mid-December
- 2. Online: Real Estate Tax Parcel (columbia.wi.us)

In addition, once you pull up your parcel you can obtain your tax receipt. Under tax information, click on the year on the left-hand side, payment information will pop-up and is printer-friendly.

- o 1st Installments are due to the City Treasurer by January 31st each year
- o 2nd Installments are due to the County Treasurers office by July 31st each year

Tax Payments

- <u>Check or Credit Card</u>- The City accepts checks and credit cards in office for tax payments.
 - Credit cards are processed by a third-party provider and there is a fee (collected by them) based on the transaction total.
- o Cash- We contract with Community Bank of Portage/BWD to take our cash payments.

Name Change

If you need to make a name change on your tax bill, you will need to contact Columbia County Register of Deeds (www.co.columbia.wi.us/columbiacounty/registerofdeeds/)

Address Change

If you need to make a billing address change on your tax bill, please write the new billing address on the tax bill stub and include a copy of the stub when making your payment.

Lottery and Gaming Credit (LGC) Available

Are you a WI Resident and your home is your primary residence? Then you may qualify for the LGC. If you do not see the credit on your tax bill, please go to the DOR Online filing application (https://ww2.revenue.wi.gov/VaultPublic/Ic/interview.html). Property owners must submit a complete application, with the appropriate documentation, to DOR by October 1, 2024 to have it appear on the current year tax bill.

<u>Guidelines for Brush/Leaf/Clipping Collection:</u> Brush Collection will take place the week of April 1, May 6, June 3, July 8, August 5, September 9, October 7, and November 4. Brush needs to be out in your boulevard by **7am Monday morning**

to be picked up that week. Leaf bags and grass clippings must be separated from the brush and be out by **7am Monday morning** as well. Leaf and grass bags may be collected separately from our brush collection. The Airport Road brush site is open for resident drop off of brush, leaves and grass clippings. This drop off site is not to be used by commercial contractors. Guidelines for brush, bagged leaves, and grass clipping collection and drop off requirements can be found on our City website at www.portagewi.gov/brush-and-grass-collection/. Items not in compliance will not be collected.

Recycling: Columbia County Recycling is the City of Portage's contractor for garbage and recycling collection. Please visit our City website for information on what can and can't be recycled at https://www.portagewi.gov/garbage-and-recycling/. Additionally, the City maintains a drop off center for residents to use for household recyclables as a supplement to curbside collection on Washington Street. Please note, this drop off site is monitored by video surveillance to ensure drop off guidelines are followed. Guidelines for drop off are posted on-site.

<u>Water Utility:</u> To ensure utility customers continue to receive quality drinking water, crews will be flushing hydrants between April 14 - May 10, 2024. During this period, you may experience some discoloration in your water. If this happens, simply run your faucet with cold water until the water clears. Water Utility crews will continue to perform meter swaps and cross connection surveys in 2024, these will be scheduled with property owners in advance.

<u>Waste Water Reminders</u>: If you have a sanitary back-up after 4:30 pm Monday-Friday, or on Saturday, Sunday, or a holiday, please call (608)742-2171.

Combined Public Works/Park & Rec. Facility: The City is pleased to announce that contractors will be breaking ground on a new shared Public Works/Park & Recreation Facility this spring. The facility will consist of developing the 9-acre site off of Cemetery Road to include a new operations building, cold storage building, salt shed, material storage containers, and a variety of equipment laydown areas. The operations building will house both Public Works and Park & Rec. staff, and will generally consist of office space, mechanic bays, fleet parking, work areas, general storage and a community room. The project is expected to be complete sometime in 2025.

PUBLIC WORKS

2024 Road Construction/Improvement Projects:

- 2024 Sidewalk Improvement Project: We will be bidding out a variety of sidewalks throughout the City for improvements in 2024. The project will consist of both new sidewalk and replacement of existing sidewalk. After bids are awarded for designated areas, a map will be posted on the City website. Abutting properties will be special assessed at 50% for the improvement costs.
- 2024 Alley Improvement Project: We will be bidding out 4 EA alleys for improvements which will include new pavement, subgrade, and storm water improvements where necessary. Project funding and bid results will determine which alleys are awarded for construction. Construction dates are to be determined. Abutting properties are special assessed 50% of the improvement costs.
 - o Alley No. 79 located between Erie and Wauona from E. Wisconsin to Thompson.
 - o Alley No. 31 located between Howard and Pleasant from Jefferson to Monroe.
 - o Alley No. 16 located between Franklin and Carroll from Jefferson to Monroe.
 - Alley No. 72 located between Superior and Washington from E. Wisconsin to Thompson.
- Street Chip Sealing: Annually, the City contracts to have designated streets in which the pavement is in relatively good shape, structurally sound and does not need subgrade or utility improvements. Chip sealing is a cost-effective preventative maintenance method to improve and extend the life of the street before more intensive improvements are needed. Streets that are chip sealed are first sealed with an application of an emulsion (asphalt and water) that adheres to the pavement surface and then a thin layer of aggregate or chips are immediately applied onto the emulsion. This creates an improved road surface that extends the life of the pavement and improves rideability. The cost for this is 100% funded with Wheel Tax revenues. After bids are awarded for designated streets, a map will be posted on the City website with locations of chip sealing.
- Street Crack Filling: Recently paved streets are crack filled to reduce water infiltration and reinforce the pavement surface. This comparatively inexpensive preventative maintenance method extends the life of pavements. The process involves sweeping the streets designated for crack filling, followed by crews using hot air lances to incinerate and remove material in the cracks. This is followed by crews applying a hot sealant into the cracks and spraying a solution onto the sealant and applying bio-degradable paper to prevent the sealant from sticking to tires while it cools. The cost for this is 100% funded with Wheel Tax revenues. After bids are awarded for designated streets, a map will be posted on the City website with locations of crack filling this summer.
- Signals Upgrades: In 2022, the City applied for grant funding through the Wisconsin
 Department of Transportation for the rehabilitation of the traffic signals at the Collins and
 Slifer Street intersections on New Pinery Road. The City received the grant funding which
 includes 90% state funding for the rehabilitation. Design work began in early 2024 with
 anticipated construction taking place this fall or early spring of 2025.

PUBLIC WORKS

- Pavement Rehabilitation: These projects, includes street excavation and
 pavement resurfacing within the limits of the existing curb line. Suellen Lane and
 Houston Street are being bid as alternates and will only be awarded if bid award is
 within budget. Construction dates are to be determined. There are no proposed
 special assessments for these projects. These projects are partially funded with
 Wheel Tax revenues.
 - Henry Drive: Village Road to Airport Road
 - Airport Road: Henry Drive to Collins Street
 - Dorothy Drive: E. Albert Street to Karla Court
 - Karla Court: Dorothy Drive to Hamilton Street
 - Suellen Lane: Karla Court to Houston Street
 - Houston Street: Dorothy Drive to Suellen Lane
- Road Reconstruction: E. Slifer Steet (New Pinery Road to Hamilton Street) This project, involves a full street reconstruction which includes storm sewer, water utility, curb & gutter spot repairs, and sidewalk curb ramp replacement, and new asphalt pavement. The design for this project began in 2023. After bids are awarded a construction schedule will be determined. Efforts are being made for work to take place starting after the 2023/2024 school year with a project completion prior to the 2024/2025 school year.

 - If you are digging or disturbing the soil you may also require an Erosion Control Permit.
 In certain cases approval from the DNR or other State agency may be required.
 - If you are performing work within or adjacent to the City-owned Right-Of-Way (ROW), you may also require a ROW permit. (Examples include: Driveway, Sidewalk, Etc.).
 - Note: please contact DIGGER's Hotline whenever performing any excavation at (800)
 242-8511 or 811.
- Why are Permits Required?
 - The permitting process is the best way to assure that the work being done meets the requirements of the City and current ordinances. It also protects current and future property owners should there be a change to those ordinances or a dispute relative to the work is performed.

I am excited to say that after 7 hiring processes in 2023, we currently have a full roster which is a huge achievement. I know will be short lived as we have an anticipated retirement this spring. We have many new officers and staff serving this community and I would encourage you to go to our website www.portagewi.gov/police and our social media platforms to keep connected. One item that can provide a lot of information beyond a newsletter is our annual reports. I would highly encourage you read through these and see the incredible work and great staff that makeup the Portage Police Department.

Class #12 of our Citizen's Police Academy is in full swing and we thank those that have taken time out of their busy schedule to gain insight on their local police department. This course is 10-weeks long which allows participants an in-depth perspective of this profession. This year we opened the enrollment to include juniors and seniors in high school hoping to foster interest in law enforcement as a career.

During our annual awards ceremony in January, many officers were recognized for their exceptional service and efforts in 2023. This included 4 VIP Tenure awards, 4 Officer tenure awards, 1 Citizen appreciation awards,7 team effort awards, 3 life saving awards, 1 Meritorious Award to Citizen Eric Erickson, and two Distinguished service awards. This was a well-attended event which was hosted at the Portage High School.

Though this winter in general has been mild, we have had two snow emergencies that resulted in parking enforcement. We understand that these events generate a lot of frustration, but the intent is to provide full access to our roadways to quickly and effectively clear the roads for safe travel. We want to remind residents that we do our best to inform residents when a snow emergency has been declared via Nixle alerts, Social Media, and other avenues. Best practice is if you know that we are expecting a large snow event chances are a snow emergency will be declared. Further information can be located on the City of Portage's website or by calling the Snow Emergency hotline at (608) 810-4200. Additionally, it is the responsibility of owners or subjects responsible for city parcels to remove snow/ice from sidewalks with 24 hours after the snowfall has ceased. Our Community Service Officers monitor this activity and seek compliance prior to the issuance of citations. As spring arrives, their focus changes to yard cleanup. Reminder that the city does offer a spring cleanup event on May 4, 8:00am-2:00pm at the City Garage located at 616 Washington Street.


The City of Portage was designated as a 'Tree City USA' for the 29th consecutive year by the Arbor Day Foundation. We were able to plant 115 new trees in 2023, around various areas of the city including New Pinery Rd, Veterans Memorial Field complex, Goodyear Park, and Collipp-Worden Park. We received over \$6500 in grants to help fund our tree plantings in 2023.

Pest Update

Over the past year, Portage has seen an increase in **Spongy moth** (formerly known as "Gypsy moth") infestations. Spongy moth can damage trees when the caterpillars defoliate trees primarily during the months of June and July. Spongy moth prefers oak species but will also feed on species such as aspen, birch, willow and crabapple. Healthy trees tend to rebound by pushing out new leaves although this process requires a lot of energy reserves. For this reason, multiple years of defoliation can lead to tree mortality, especially when multiple stressors are present. If you are concerned about your trees, the best thing you can do is keep them well watered during the growing season but especially during times of drought. Adding a layer of mulch 2–3" deep will also help to reduce environmental stressors. If you are still concerned about your trees you have a few options:



Destroy egg masses- Destroy egg masses (November-April) by spraying them with a horticultural oil labeled for spongy moth egg masses (available online or lawn and garden centers) or by scraping them off into a bucket of soapy water and discard after 24 hours. Don't just scrape egg masses onto the ground or crush them with your shoe as they can survive to hatch next spring.

Place barrier bands on tree trunks— Just after caterpillars have hatched (late April), when they are small and young, barrier bands will prevent them from climbing back into trees. Barrier bands can be purchased or made using duct tape or other nonporous material that can be wrapped around a tree trunk and coated with commercially available (online or lawn and garden centers) sticky material such as Tanglefoot or Catchmaster. At a convenient height, wrap a belt of duct tape 4-6inches

wide around each tree trunk shiny side out and with the tape pressed firmly into bark crevices. Smear the center of the band with a sticky material. Sticky material may need to be re-applied periodically due to rain or other environmental conditions as well as when bands are covered with caterpillars.

Burlap collection bands- When caterpillars are about 1 inch long (early June), many will begin a daily migration down the tree to hide from predators. You can take advantage of this behavior by creating a band of burlap that the caterpillars will want to hide under, so you can easily destroy them. Cut a piece of burlap 12-24 inches wide and long enough to completely wrap around the tree at chest height. Tie a piece of string around the middle of the burlap and fold the upper portion down to form a "skirt" around the tree. Every afternoon check under the burlap and brush any caterpillars into a bucket of soapy water to kill them. Remove the bands in August once the caterpillars are no longer seen.

If you have high value trees, or when very large numbers of caterpillars are present, I recommend contacting a certified arborist for treatment recommendations.
