Message From The Mayor



Welcome to 2021, and good bye to 2020. It was a year that most would like to forget. Of course, I am talking about the corona virus. Yes, there are several vaccinations available, but from all indications it will take until late spring/summer to get the majority of Americans vaccinated. Until that time, the current covid-19 protocols will continue at City owned buildings, and public meetings will continue to be virtual.

At the end of last year, we had a longtime alderperson resign. We are in the process of filling this position. I you reside within the ninth district and

This year the reconstruction of East Wisconsin Street will begin. This project will completely reconstruct all four lanes and Edgewater/DeWitt intersection. Project scope is from Ontario Street (South end) to Pleasant Street (North end). While this is a major construction project, all attempts will be made to maintain two of the four lanes open during construction. As the start date nears, traffic patterns and alternate routes will be communicated on the City Facebook and web pages. This construction will be extensive and we ask for everyone's patience during this time.

The preconstruction work on the canal was completed last fall, the work of on the canal will start in earnest this summer. As the canal is owned by the state, this project will be under DNR control. The scope of work will be from Adams Street to the CP railroad bridge. It will dredge the length and reconstruct the banks. On the south side, there will be a base for a multi-use path to be constructed in 2022. This path will provide a safer route for the Ice Age Trail.

Because of Covid-19, I have not held a listening session in 2020. I miss these opportunities to hear your issues. That does not mean that you cannot voice your concerns. You may contact me by email at <u>rick.dodd@portagewi.gov</u> or through the contact portal on the city's website.

Once it is safe again, I will schedule an in-person listening sessions. Portage is **your** City and it takes everyone's involvement to move it forward and keep it a great place to live, work and play. Lastly, I would like to thank all of you for your support through this pandemic journey. Whether it was adapting to new voting routines, waiting to make a payment, or just the confusion as we worked through revised processes. The staff and elected officials appreciate the sacrifices you made and your patience is very much appreciated.

City Newsletter Message From the City Administrator

Portage Airport

In January, 2021 the Common Council, after hearing options and recommendations from an aeronautical consultant (TKDA), the Wisconsin Bureau of Aeronautics(BOA), Federal Aviation Administration(FAA), an Ad Hoc Airport Technical Advisory Committee and the Airport Commission, voted to make safety improvements at the present airport and pursue the process to relocate the airport to another location adjacent to Portage. This decision by the Council was made after 2 years of analyzing and evaluating options including complete closure of the airport, expanding the current airport or making minor improvements to keep the airport in its current configuration. The process to find a site to relocate and construct a new airport will take years, necessitating repairs and improvements at the current airport to keep it functional until a new airport is opened. There are many hurdles, challenges and approvals to achieve in order for a new airport to be constructed and all of these have to be done with the approval of the BOA and FAA as well as the Council. But after 80 years at its present location, the Portage Airport had become confined and unable to feasibly expand or accommodate modern aircraft. This is the 1st step in a long process but it was an important step.

Employees Transitions/Milestones: Each year I recognize new employees who joined the City and those employees who reach work anniversary milestones.

<u>New Faces</u>: Casey Crary was selected in August, 2020 as Police Adm. Asst. In September, 2020 Adam Kreger joined the Public Works Dept as a Crewperson. Troy Haase was selected as Fire Chief in December, 2020. Jesse Sprague was sworn in as a Patrol Officer in March, 2020 and Austin Valenta was sworn in as Patrol Officer in January, 2021.

<u>Several employees changed titles recently</u>: Ryan Armson from Public Works was selected as a fire fighter in March, 2020 succeeding Andy Anderson who retired after 33 years. Pete Warning was promoted to Detective in April, 2020. Off. Kate Behling was selected as the School Resource Officer in May, 2020. Det. Lt. Dan Garrigan was promoted to Captain in October, 2020. We also bid farewell to Clayton Simonson, Jr. Fire Chief who retired in December, 2020 – 16 years

With 2020 behind us, The Police Department started this year fully-staffed and I am optimistic that 2021 will eventually bring back a sense of normalcy; whatever that may look like. In my first year as Police Chief there was no wading slowly into Silver Lake until I was acclimated, it was more like being thrown into the Wisconsin River. I thank the efforts of each officer and proud of them for getting us through a challenging year.

After reorganizing the command structure and our staff, the goal (and still is) was to be ever-so-connected to our community. To accomplish this, we had to adapt and utilize other means of communication relying heavily on

technology. In this newsletter, I want to focus on how we plan to keep you and our community informed. To report some upgrades, the police department's entrance is close to having a makeover which will help identify our location with new signage. The police department also obtained new digital radios and are in the process of establishing another transmitter on the northside of Portage to enhance police radio communications.

Being the Winter Newsletter, I must reinforce your obligations of clearing snow from sidewalks and moving vehicles on city streets within 24 hours after a snowfall. This allows our Public Works Department to keep our roadways safe for travel. If measurable snow is expected, a snow emergency may be declared. The police department's lobby continues to be closed to the public and we have no public events planned due to the persistent pandemic. This unfortunately meant cancelling the Citizens Police Academy for 2021. Looking to Make Improvements to your Home?

The City of Portage has received a Community Development Block Grant (CDBG). The CDBG is a 0% interest, deferred loan that can be used by Homeowners, Homebuyers, and Rental Property Owners (monthly payments) that meet the program's requirements.

The CDBG money can be used for various eligible repairs and replacements including: Handicap accessibility adaptions, heating systems, water heaters, plumbing and electrical systems, insulating attic and sidewalls, exterior improvements, including roofing, painting, siding, porch repairs, lead-based paint removal.

Business Development and Planning

Late 2020 saw the following new developments and businesses reach completion:

- K & M Tire Distribution Center, a new 50,000 sf Phase 1 development, 2500 Boeck Road
- S & L Co (Culvers Franchise) headquarters 6,600 sf expansion, 2651 Kirking Ct
- Burger King, a new 3,300 restaurant, 2960 New Pinery Road
- Arbys, 2921 New Pinery Road
- The newly redeveloped **Portage Mart**, a Liberty Kwik Stop, has opened at 601 E. Wisconsin Street.

Construction of a **new Alliant Electric Substation** on Cemetery Road, an impressive 15 acre development, is currently underway off of Cemetery Rd/CTH O. Once completed, this new electric infrastructure development will help meet Portage's growing electrical needs, particularly industrial, in the years ahead.

9 new **Single Family homes** were constructed in 2020, a record number in recent history. This new home construction has been led by Valido Homes, Pewaukee, recruited to Portage in late 2019. Homes built by Valido Homes were constructed on Moorland Cir, Eagle Ridge Ct and W. Slifer Street.

City of Portage discussions with both single family and multifamily developers are currently underway to bring new residential construction to Portage.

Upcoming Developments:

- **Dollar General** will construct a new 9,800 sf store on a newly configured –and soon to be redeveloped 38,000 sf parcel at Brady Street and E. Wisconsin Street in the Spring.
- Former DSH Nursing Home, 715 W. Pleasant St. New owner and developer JD Kath is working with a Milwaukee development firm to put together a redevelopment proposal for this site, including residential.
- Several manufacturing businesses will be expanding in 2021 with a planned additions or new product lines.
- Development of a **new industrial facility** is expected to move ahead on a 20 acre site in the Portage Industrial park. The multi-phase development, including a rail spur, is expected to start later in 2021.
- Remediation, and renovation/redevelopment of former Antique Mall/Strip It Shop, 114 W. Cook Street, is expected under the helm of the Community Development Authority (CDA) in partnership with a private developer. The City applied for and received a DNR WAM environmental assessment grant as Columbia County is moving to foreclose on the property for delinquent property taxes, transferring title to the City.

New Businesses:

- MSI Auto Sales has opened at 515 E. Wisconsin Street
- Portage Motors has relocated to 116 Brooks Street.
- Fisher King Winery distribution center has relocated from the Madison area and opened in the Portage Enterprise Center.
- The Framery, 233 W. Cook St

- Main Street Consignment, 13 Main St
- Green Berry Smoothies, 2931 New Pinery Rd (Opens March 2)
- Sadly, **Stock+Field** will close all stores, including Portage, in 2021.
- The Portage Enterprise Center will see four additional new welding stations (for a total of 10)
 have been added to the Advanced Manufacturing Training Center. This will allow for more
 welding class capacity and training and an additional two welding camps for middle school
 students in the coming years.

After a year-long process, including a significant public engagement process, the Plan Commission and City Council have adopted a **sign code update**, now in effect. The sign code revision was necessary to comply with the *Reed v. Gilbert* Supreme Court decision and Wisconsin State Statutes. In addition, it reflects modern business sign practices and new sign technology, and increase user-friendliness and administration.

Portage COVID-19 Business Relief Loan Program

The City of Portage COVID-19 Business Relief Loan program is available to Portage businesses that have been adversely impacted due to the COVID-19 pandemic. Eligible businesses must have less than 20 employees, have a physical presence in the city of Portage, and have been in business at least two months prior to March 12, 2020.

The maximum loan amount is \$2,000 with a 0 percent interest rate.

Fire Department



Chief Clayton Simonson, Jr. retired from the Portage Fire Department on February 5, 2021. As the new Chief, I want to thank Chief Simonson for his dedication and commitment for the past 16 years as chief and 41 total years on the department.

I want to thank the Portage Police & Fire Commission and the City staff for allowing me this opportunity to lead a great group of people. I look forward to providing the leadership necessary to move this organization forward over the next decade. I am a native of Portage, and served as a member of the Portage Fire Department for three years. In 1993, I was hired by the Two Rivers Fire

Department and spent 5 years there before being hired by Fond du Lac Fire Rescue. I served 22 years as a firefighter/paramedic and finished my career as the Division Chief of Fire Prevention. I retired from Fond du Lac in April of 2020 and my wife and I moved back to Portage in May. My wife, Angie works for the Columbia County Sheriff's Department as a dispatcher. I have two children, Tanner who will graduate from the University of Indianapolis with Bachelor's Degree in Exercise Science in May. My daughter Tianna will graduate with a Bachelor's Degree in Elementary Education and Special Education in December.

As the new Chief I want the community to understand there is a large commitment to serve as a firefighter. Firefighters are expected to be on call 24/7, leave their job at a moment's notice, miss family dinners and rush to the scene of an emergency. They place themselves in harm's way for the sake of quite often, a complete stranger's life and property. I believe we all take for granted the time and effort that goes into the hundreds of hours of training that these men and women put forth, because of their dedication to helping others.

But it is not only the firefighters that make sacrifices while serving our community, but also the families that allow us to do this special voluntary work. I want to say thank you to our families. Thank-you for allowing your lives and time with your brave loved one to be interrupted and endangered in a moment's notice. Your support and sacrifice is priceless not only to your loved one but to all of us in the Portage and surrounding communities.

The Portage Fire Department currently has 26 members, 6 full time and 20 paid-on-call members. We also have a full time Administrative Assistant. We are currently looking for people who would like to become a paid-on-call member of the department. There is *No Experience Needed* and we provide all training and gear necessary. If you are interested in obtaining an application to join, you can pick it up at the fire station or online at the City's website, <u>https://www.portagewi.gov/fire/</u>. Please feel free to contact us anytime at (608) 742-2172 with any questions.

The department would like to encourage residents to replace the batteries (9 volt and AA) in their **Smoke Alarms** and **Carbon Monoxide Alarms**. We have batteries available at the fire station. If assistance is needed with installing the batteries in your smoke or carbon monoxide alarms, please contact the fire department at (608) <u>742-2172</u> and someone will schedule a time to come and assist. The batteries we receive are donated each year by Ray-o-Vac/Energizer.

The City of Portage requires a burn permit for all open burning other than outdoor recreational fire pits or fireplaces. The permit can be found on the Portage Fire Department website or you can stop into the station. For those of you that live outside of the City and wish to burn, you must contact the DNR at <u>https://dnr.wi.gov/burnpermits</u> or 1-888-947-2876. Due to the Coronavirus there are no in person DNR burn permits being issued.

On behalf of the department I would like to thank the Mayor, City Administrator, the Portage Council members, the four Town Chairpersons, and all the citizens and businesses for their continued support throughout the year. It is very much appreciated by our members.

If we do not meet the minimum number of participants by the registration deadline, the program will be cancelled. We also set registration maximums on each program based on staff, equipment, and space, so be sure to register early in order to reserve your spot before they are all gone!

Say 'Cheese'- For program promotional purposes, photographs may be taken of participants. If you do not wish to have your photo, or photos of your children taken, please notify our department.

Residents vs. Non-Residents- All program and park shelter rentals will list 2 prices under the description. (example- \$15/\$25). The first price is for residents of the City of Portage or Pacific Township. The second price is for non-residents (Lewiston, Caledonia, Fort Winnebago, Pardeeville, etc.). Non-resident fees are charged to help our department continue to maintain our programs and facilities.

Scholarships- The City of Portage wishes to offer our programs and activities to all area children. If financial assistance is needed for a child's participation, please contact our department for more information. Park Shelter Rentals and select programs do not qualify for our scholarship program.

Typos/Mistakes- Occasionally, there may be an error in days, times, registration requirements, pricing, or location in our program descriptions. When such errors occur, our staff will do everything possible to correct the situation promptly. Our department reserves the right to change program schedules as needed to accommodate demand or school/community conflicts.

Program Refund Policy- Refunds will be granted if requests are made seven (7) days prior to the scheduled start of the activity. Please contact our department if you have questions regarding refunds due to medical or unavoidable circumstances. All refunds carry a \$5.00 processing fee.

Facility Rental Refund Policy- Refunds for facility rentals will be granted if requests are made thirty (30) days prior to scheduled rental. Extenuating circumstances are occasionally considered. All refunds carry a \$5.00 processing fee.

Notice to Destroy Weeds

The City requires that all noxious weeds be destroyed prior to the time in which such plants would mature to the bloom or flower state. The growth of noxious weeds in excess of eight inches in height from the ground surface shall be prohibited within the city corporate limits. Noxious weeds shall include any weed, grass or similar plant growth which, if allowed to pollinate, would cause or produce hay fever in human beings or would cause a skin rash through contact with the skin.
